


# Weak online hiring sentiment in August casts a gloomy shadow over Singapore's job market

- Singapore saw a 3% year-on-year decline in online hiring activity in August 2017, according to the latest Monster Employment Index (MEI)
- The BFSI sector saw the highest growth in online hiring activity at 10% year-on-year, while the Government/ PSU/ Defence sector reported the most decline at -11% year-on-year
- Health Care jobs saw the most demand at 9% year-on-year
- Roles in Customer Service registered the sharpest annual decline at -13%



**SINGAPORE, 24 October 2017 –** Online hiring in Singapore took another plunge, reporting a 3% year-on-year decline between August 2016 and August 2017.

This is according to the latest <u>Monster Employment Index (MEI)</u>, a gauge of online job posting activities compiled monthly by <u>Monster.com</u>. The Index also records the industries and occupations that show the highest and lowest growth in recruitment activity locally.

This August, the BFSI sector led online hiring in Singapore for the third consecutive month, reporting a 10% year-on-year growth.

On the other hand, the Government/ PSU/ Defence sector continued to see the sharpest year-on-year decline amongst all other sectors at -11%.

When looking at the occupational groups monitored by the Index, Health Care professionals, were most in demand amongst employers, reporting a strong 9% year-on-year growth in hiring activity.

Demand for Customer Service professionals saw the sharpest drop in online hiring, reporting a 13% year-on-year decline.

"According to the latest MAS survey, economists expect the economy to accelerate growth to 3.1 per cent in the third quarter, but slowing sharply to 1.8 per cent towards the end of the year. And despite strong steps by the government, we are unlikely to see a drastic improvement in Singapore's labour market which will remain soft in the short-term", said Sanjay Modi, Managing Director, Monster.com – APAC and Middle East.



"The ongoing business restructuring, talent shortage, skills mismatch and shifts in the labour force within Singapore are some of the hurdles facing the jobs market. However, in line with our MEI, the healthcare sector in Singapore is growing rapidly due to an ageing population, consequently leading to a demand for medical professionals is growing. Having said that, the dip in work permit holders is making it tougher for employers hiring talent with niche skills, who are working with tight budgets and need to maintain a constant watch on their headcount."

The <u>Monster Employment Index Singapore</u> is a monthly gauge of online job posting activity, based on a real-time review of millions of employer job opportunities culled from a large representative selection of career websites and online job listings across Singapore. The Index does not reflect the trend of any one advertiser or source, but is an aggregate measure of the change in job listings across the industry.
