


Singapore's Online Recruitment Activity Sees Slight Improvement: Healthcare Sector Takes Lead

- Online recruitment in Singapore is still in decline with -5% annual dip in December
 2015. However, this is small positive step from November's -8% decline
- The Healthcare sector reported the steepest growth at 6% year-over-year. The Consumer Goods/ FMCG, Food & Packaged Food, Home Appliance, Garments/ Textiles/ Leather, Gems & Jewellery performed the worst at -13%
- Demands for Healthcare and Customer Service professionals were the greatest, both at 3% year-over-year, while Software, Hardware, Telecom roles experienced the sharpest decline at -13% year-over-year



SINGAPORE, **26 JANUARY 2016** – Singapore's online hiring activity has fallen -5% between December 2014 and 2015. This is a marginal improvement from November's -8% year-over-year decline, according to the latest Monster Employment Index (MEI) Singapore.

The MEI is a gauge of online job posting activities, recording the industries and occupations that show the highest and lowest growth in recruitment activity locally.

The Healthcare sector continued to report the steepest growth among all industries surveyed, at 6% year-over-year – a jump from November's -2% year-over-year decline.

It is also the only sector to record positive annual growth between December 2014 and 2015.

On the other hand, the Consumer Goods/FMCG, Food & Packaged Food, Home Appliance, Garments/Textiles/Leather, Gems & Jewellery sector reported the steepest decline at -13% year-over-year.

Among the occupational groups surveyed, the demands for Healthcare and Customer Service professionals are both in the lead at 3% year-over-year growth, with the latter group witnessing its first positive annual growth in 12 months.



Demand for Software, Hardware and Telecom professionals emerged the weakest in December at -13% year-over-year. This is in spite of the slowing pace of decline between November and December 2015.

"In December, many companies are likely to have undergone some internal restructuring, helping employers feel more ready when it comes to hiring, and employers' confidence is likely to be boosted by seeing the economic resilience of many neighbouring countries in the region. In 2016, it is likely we will witness more MNCs hiring local workers due to the increased restrictions on the hiring of foreign workers," said **Sanjay Modi, Managing Director of Monster.com (India, Middle East, Southeast Asia, Hong Kong).**

The Monster Employment Index Singapore is a monthly gauge of online job posting activity, based on a real-time review of millions of employer job opportunities culled from a large representative selection of career websites and online job listings across Singapore. The Index does not reflect the trend of any one advertiser or source, but is an aggregate measure of the change in job listings across the industry.
